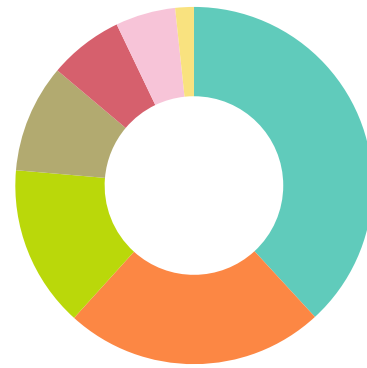


OUTCOMES SIX MONTHS AFTER GRADUATION
